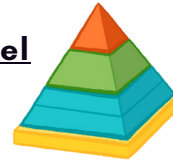

The goal of the program is to support the adults who work to ensure the healthy development and well-being of all infants, young children, and their families throughout Wisconsin.



Wisconsin Pyramid Model



WI-AIMH coordinates training, coaching and resources for programs and communities to use the Pyramid Model framework. Pyramid Model programs and communities provide safe and responsive environments for infants, toddlers, young children and the adults who care for them. The framework is a set of strategies for adults to use that prevent challenging behavior and promote healthy social and emotional skill development.
