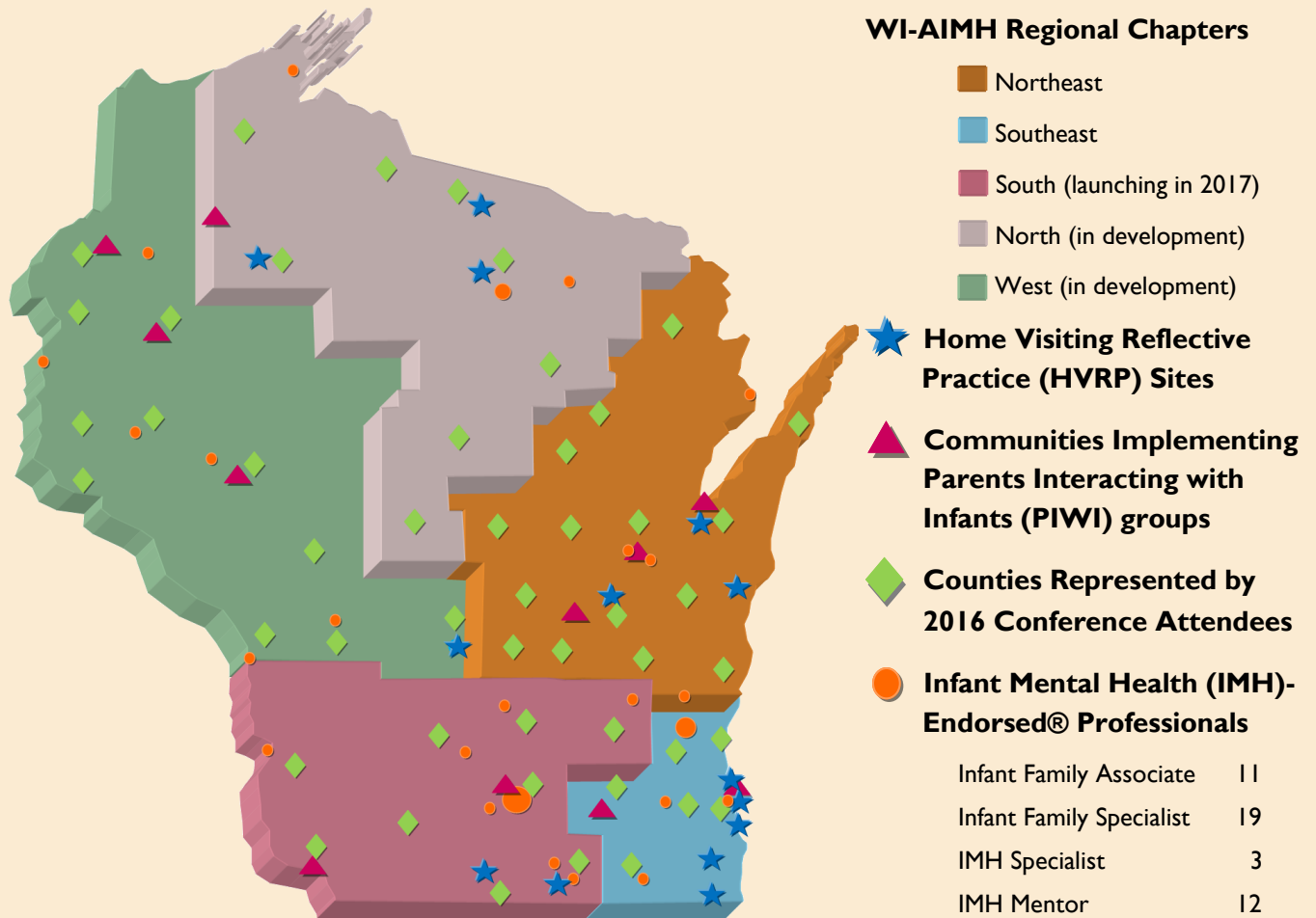


Wisconsin Alliance for Infant Mental Health 2016 Annual Report Statewide Impact



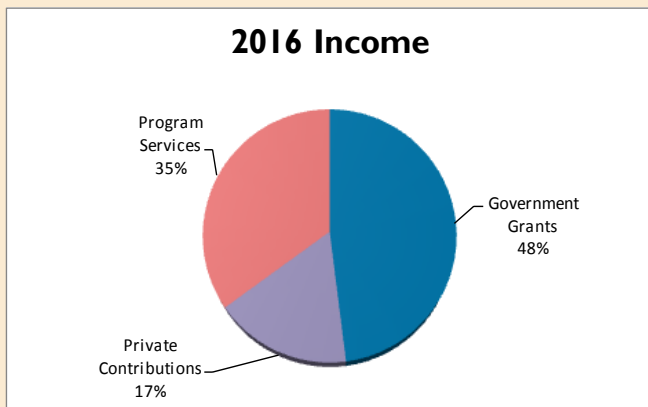

Our Values:

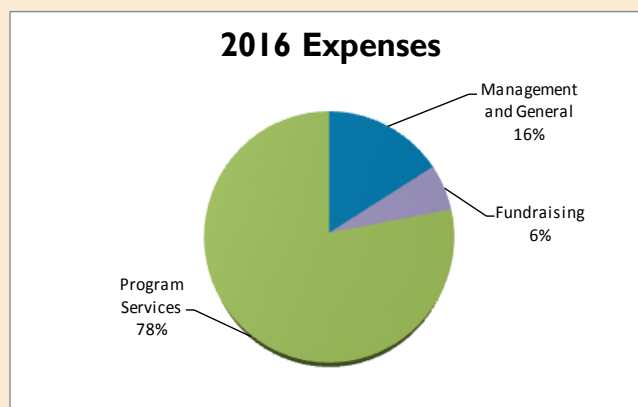
- Relationships are central to all aspects of our work

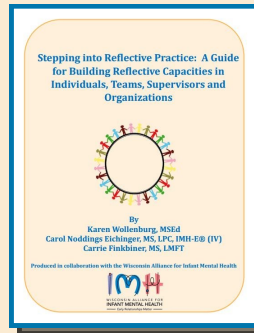
Highlights of 2016

In collaboration with the WI Department of Children and Families, WI-AIMH supported **13 consultants** and **6 mentors** to integrate reflective practices into **14 home visiting sites**.

WI-AIMH staff provided expertise on Infant Mental Health (IMH) and relationship-based practices at **62 state policy meetings and events!**

WI-AIMH provided leadership at the state level for the **Pyramid Model for Social Emotional Competence**. In 2016, program-wide implementation expanded into **12 new programs** around the state!



WI-AIMH developed *Stepping into Reflective Practice: A Guide for Building Reflective Capacities in Individuals, Teams, Supervisors and Organizations*, and hosted a training retreat for Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultants.

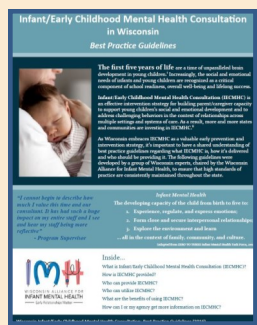

Our website, www.wiaimh.org, received **34,048 views**, a **28% increase** from 2015!



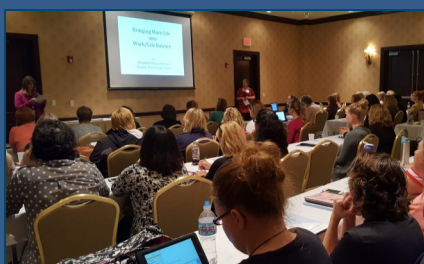
WI-AIMH membership **increased by 66%** in 2016! See the roster at www.wiaimh.org/2016-members.

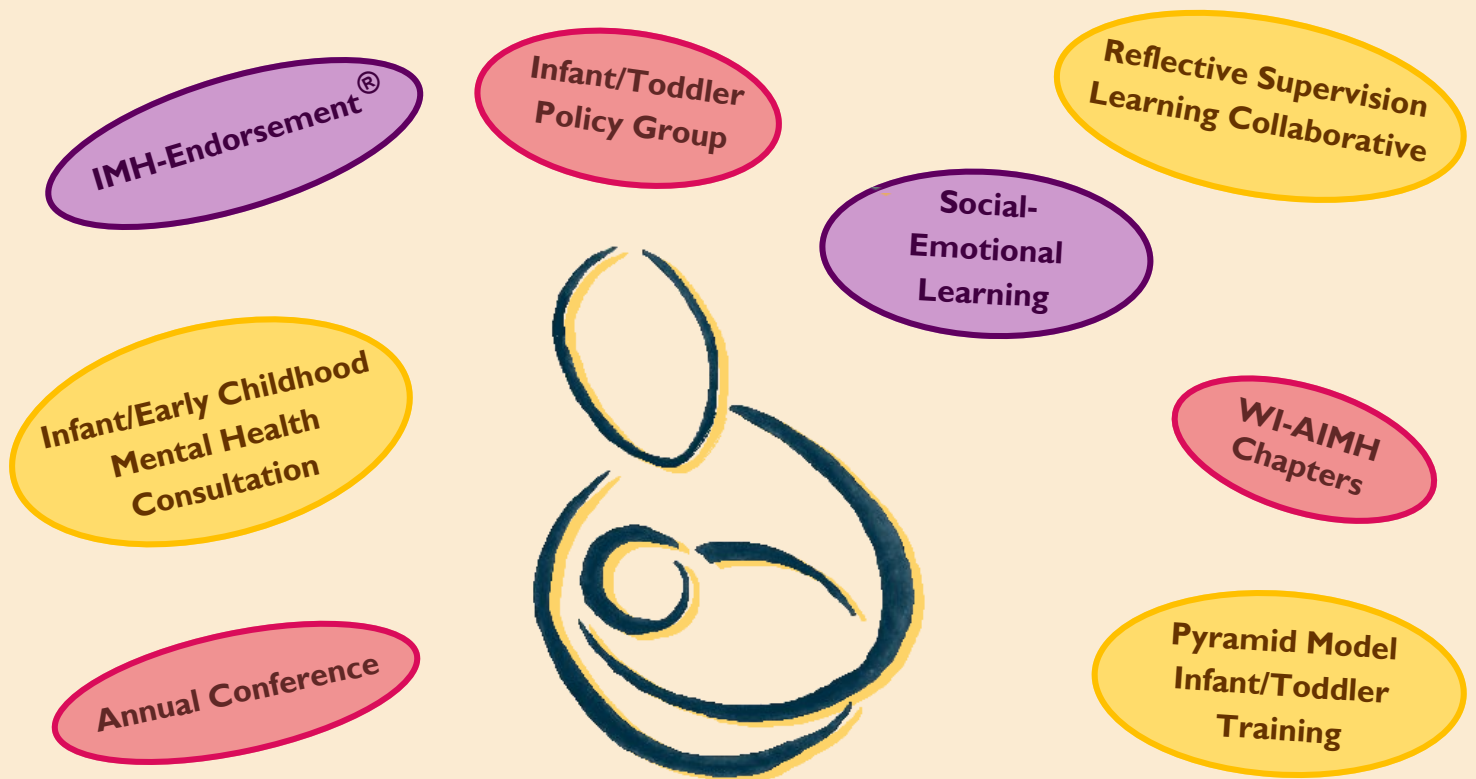
